

Map



Introduction

We tell stories of cultural connections. Here you will be able to experience artworks from different cultures throughout history, side-by-side. You might realise we have more in common than we know.

The First Villages G1

As you begin your journey, we mark the starting point of the collective history of the world. Discover how, by around 10,000 BCE communities began to settle in the first villages, and were bound together by shared beliefs and rituals.

The First Great Powers G2, 2.1, 2.2

Learn about the rise of kingdoms around 3,000 BCE, which was a crucial event in the history of humanity, resulting in clashes, movement of populations and the emergence of powerful hierarchies.

Civilisations and Empires G3

Later, around 1,000 BCE, and until 500 CE, even more powerful kingdoms and empires emerge and disappear in turn all around the world. The imprint they left on their territories stimulated cultural diversity and artistic exchanges.



Overview Galleries 4–6

The movement of pilgrims, conquerors, and merchants catalysed thriving cultural exchanges. Civilisations in Africa, Asia, and Europe were brought into contact and transformed through the circulation of knowledge, thought and artistic expression.

Universal Religions G4, 4.1

Beginning around 2,000 years ago, the universal religions succeeded in reaching most of the civilised areas of Europe, Asia and Africa. By addressing their message to all humanity, Buddhism, Christianity and Islam deeply transformed communities, influencing intellectual and artistic activity across continents.

Silk Roads G5

The expansion of universal religions paralleled the development of a vast network of cross-continental land and sea routes connecting Africa, Asia, and Europe. Find out how this flourishing trade route contributed to the circulation of commodities and artistic and intellectual exchanges.

Lords, Kings and Caliphs G6, 6.1, 6.2

Chivalry, in the West, and furusiyya, in the East, were shared models of the accomplished and educated man during the Middle Ages. These two facets of similar social groups came into contact in Spain, Sicily and the Middle East, and despite religious and political rivalries, fostered positive cultural relations.

Overview Galleries 7–9

At the end of the 15th Century, navigators encountered new civilisations for the first time. A more global economy developed in which art and culture in Europe, China, and the Islamic world flourished.

First Globalisation G7, 7.1

The territorial and commercial expansion between the 15th and 18th centuries brought radical changes. The emergence of new empires transformed societies as rulers made art a tool of government and a display of power.

World Empires G8, 8.1, 8.2

New systems of global exchange and the emergence of new empires transformed societies and territories, resulting in the displacement of people. Artists and craftsmen visualised these developments and explored new materials and techniques.

Towards a Modern World G9, 9.1

By established global trade networks, affluence was no longer exclusively the privilege of monarchs but was increasingly attainable by a large segment of society, the middle class. The spread of manufactured products transformed economies and stimulated consumption.







10–12 Modern Era 1850–Present day





Overview Galleries 10–12

The Industrial Revolution, technological advancements, socio-political changes, colonial expansion and later decolonisation paved the way for a wider range of artistic and cultural exchanges. The period saw the invention of photography, cinema, and abstract art.

Multiple Modernities G10, 10.1

The technical advancements of the Industrial Revolution opened new horizons, facilitating the circulation of goods and people, as well as information, images, and artistic movements. This gave 19th century artists many new sources of inspiration.

A Global Stage G11, 11.1

During the 20th century, artists reflected the changes and uncertainties resulting from two world wars. These factors, alongside the consequences of industrialisation, led to the emergence of new global movements such as Abstraction and Surrealism.

Epilogue G12

Presenting a new thematic every two years, Epilogue brings the visitor's journey to an end while marking a new beginning – an opportunity to question, reflect, and broaden one's perspective.






